2. CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL MEN'S DAY

On 19th November 2019 International Men's Day was celebrated at Moot Court Hall. Dr. B.G. Ponnappa, President, PURE, Mysuru and also alumni student of our college was invited as chief guest. He spoke on the theme 'making a Difference for Men and Boys'.





3. SPECIAL LECTURE

On 17th July, 2020 special lecture on RTI was organized online. Prof K.S Suresh, CEO, JSS Law College and also alumni of our college spoke of RTI. He mentioned that Right to Information is not included as a Fundamental Right in the Constitution of India, yet it protects the fundamental rights to Freedom of Expression and Speech under Article 19(1)(a) and Right to Life and Personal Liberty under Article 21 guaranteed by the Constitution. The authorities under RTI Act 2005 are called public authorities. The Public Information Officer (PIO) or the First Appellate Authority in the public authorities performs quasi-judicial function of deciding on the application and appeal respectively. This act was enacted in order to consolidate the fundamental right in the Indian constitution 'freedom of speech'. Since RTI is implicit in the Right to Freedom of Speech and Expression under Article 19 of the Indian Constitution, it is an implied fundamental right. All government agencies, whether they are under a state government or the Centre, come under the purview of the Act.
